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BCH to Perform the First Robotics-**Assisted Total Knee Arthroplasty**



oone County Hospital is excited to offer roboticsassisted total and partial knee arthroplasty this spring using the NAVIO® Surgical System. This surgical milestone performed by Dr. Craig Mahoney, orthopedic surgeon, will represent one of the first CT-free, robotics-assisted total and partial knee surgery procedures using this system in the world.

"With any total knee surgery, final placement of the implant is critical to providing both the function and longevity that patients expect," says Dr. Mahoney. "With this system, I'm able to see real-time data throughout

the surgery that is designed to help place each implant in the best location based on each patient's unique anatomy."

Unlike other robotics-assisted platforms, the NAVIO system does not require a pre-operative CT-scan. Instead, the surgeon collects patientspecific data during the procedure to build a 3D model of the patient's knee. This is used to plan the surgery. To perform the procedure, a hand-held robotics-assisted tool (the NAVIO hand piece) is used to position NAVIO-specific cut guides exactly as intended, based on the patient-specific data previously collected. This extra layer of precision and accuracy is

designed to enable optimal implant placement for better patient outcomes.

Dr. Mahoney adds, "The introduction of robotic assistance should have knee replacement candidates feeling very confident about the future of knee surgery. I believe this technology has great promise and will eventually be used in many orthopedic surgical procedures."

The health coach from your physician's office will be calling you two business days after your discharge. Your coach will discuss any questions or concerns you may have with your hospitalization, review your medications and confirm your followup appointment

Project Updates 2018-2019

PATIENT ROOM REMODEL

The room remodel project was ignited in 2017 by a \$20,000 private gift from a Boone couple. The Foundation continued the fundraising efforts to remodel the entire patient unit, and to-date has secured over \$200,000 toward completion of 14 of the 20 rooms. The updates include new flooring (in hallways), new patient beds, new bedside tables, over bed tables, recliners, and window treatments. SOUTH GARDEN POND REVITALIZATION

In 2018, the Foundation was approached by Eric Twigg of Aquatic Sphere Construction and Design about revitalizing the pond in the south garden. Two donors have contributed to help in this revitalization project to make the garden a sanctuary for patients and visitors to go to while visiting the Hospital. The pond was completed in the fall, with plans to refresh the rest of the garden space in the spring. The pond will be operational and even house koi fish for visitors to enjoy while visiting. NEW AMBULANCE

From 2014 to present, the Foundation has grown its endowment to over one million dollars thanks to the support of the Boone County community. The purpose of the endowment is to draw down only the interest from this fund and use it toward a significant project that has been identified for the Foundation to financially support. In 2017, the Foundation gave over \$100,000 toward 3D mammography equipment for Radiology. In 2018, the Foundation purchased a new echocardiogram for Technical Services. In 2019, the Foundation has secured over \$100,000 toward the purchase of a new ambulance.

Boone County Hospital (BCH) serves all of the communities within Boone County as well as providing mutual aid response to

surrounding Dallas and Story Counties. According to the U.S. Census Bureau, Boone County has a total area of 574 square miles and 26,306 residents.

Over the last 40 years, the Ambulance Department's volume has increased from 1,746 runs per year to 2,828 in 2018. There has been no increase to the number of full time equivalents (FTE) or ambulances during the life of the ambulance service, yet the service volume has nearly doubled.

What Conditions Can Be Seen in the Walk-in Clinic?

ince opening its doors in the summer of 2016, the Walk-in Clinic has proven to be a benefit to the Boone community for individuals in need of prompt medical care.

The clinic, located at 120 South Story Street, is open seven days a week: 9 a.m. to 8 p.m., Monday-Friday; 9 a.m. to 7 p.m., Saturday; and 9 a.m. to 5:30 p.m., Sunday.

Conditions that can be treated:

- Sore throat and sinus infection
- · Nausea, vomiting, diarrhea
- Sprains and strains
- Splint application
- Urinary tract infection
- Migraine
- Upper respiratory infection
- Simple wounds and lacerations
- · Skin rash and infections
- Nose bleed packing
- · Cuts and minor burns
- Allergic reaction to a bug bite
- Ear infection
- Superficial foreign body removal

There are certain conditions that should not be seen in the Clinic and patients with these conditions should schedule an appointment with their primary care provider or if it's an emergency, go straight to the Emergency Room at Boone County Hospital. The staff in the Clinic does not have the capabilities to manage the following illnesses/ situations and are not the appropriate level of care.

Included are:

- Anxiety/depression
- Follow-up care
- · Second opinions
- Suspected cardiac chest pain
- Suspected stroke symptoms
- Medication refills or prescribing of narcotic pain medications
